SPECIAL RULES

1. Exhibitors shall not knowingly exhibit animals in any ALSA class (including performance and showmanship) that, in their opinion, exhibit unsoundness as described in the ALSA Handbook.
2. Judges shall not knowingly allow exhibition of animals in any ALSA class (including performance and showmanship) that, in their opinion, exhibit unsoundness as described in the ALSA Handbook.
3. Show Management shall not knowingly allow exhibition of animals in any ALSA class (including performance and showmanship) that, in their opinion, exhibit unsoundness as described in the ALSA Handbook. Show Management shall request exhibitors to remove animals from the fairgrounds which exhibit unsoundness or do not represent the best of the llama community by their conformation, condition and/or attitude.
4. Every llama will be inspected upon arrival and before unloading by an on-site veterinarian assistant.
5. All llamas 5 months and older entered in approved classes, must be registered with the ILR. EXCEPTION: Non-breeder llamas entered only in youth classes do not have to be registered.
6. Non-Breeder Llamas are defined as geldings, vasectomized males, spayed or nonreproductive females all of which are suitable for purposes other than breeding. A registration or veterinarian certificate verifying the above conditions must accompany these llamas.
7. ILR registration numbers are required to be provided on the entry forms.
8. ORIGINAL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES MUST BE PRESENTED TO MANAGEMENT WHEN THE ANIMALS ARRIVE AND BE AVAILABLE UPON REQUEST AT ANYTIME.

9. A PHOTOCOPY OF THE REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE OR APPLICATION PENDING FOR EACH LLAMA ENTERED MUST ACCOMPANY YOUR ENTRY FORMS.
10. Include your llamas ALSA number in addition to registration number if you want to receive ALSA points for this show. Youth exhibitors must also provide ALSA number to receive points for this show. All exhibitors will be required to provide their ALSA membership card to verify membership to the clerk upon check in. This is an ALSA requirement.
11. Junior exhibitors that officially enter and show in Junior Division classes at the California State Fair are eligible to compete in this event without jeopardizing their junior status. No other California Juniors will be eligible without jeopardizing their junior status. All juniors must officially enter and pay entry fees by the July 18 deadline. This competition is open to out-of-state juniors that meet California age requirements for 4-H and FFA.
12. All animals are subject to Livestock Rules and General Rules in the California State Fair Open Livestock Competition Handbook.
13. Exhibitors and Handlers are responsible for all other rules and regulations of this Competition Handbook.
14. Entry Fees: A \$20.00 per entry per class fee for all open, conformation, group, youth, showmanship and performance classes is required. Breakdown of entry fees are as follows: \$14.00 shall be used as an entry fee and CAL-ILA will retain \$6.00 for expenses.
15. All get and produce exhibited in Get of Sire and Produce of Dam classes must have been entered in and competed in individual halter classes. If exhibitors of the Get of Sire and Produce of Dam classes are not the sire's/dam's owner, they must have written permission from the sire/dam owner. ALSA points for these classes will go to the sire and dam of these classes.
16. A single \$20.00 fee is required for Get of Sire Class of three animals. A single \$20.00 fee is required for Produce of Dam class of two animals. Entrants involved in these classes must decide who in the group will pay the fee and so stipulate on the entry form.
17. Llama pens are 12 feet long by 6 feet wide and 40 inches tall. All exhibitors are required to pay a pen fee of \$10.00 for every pen requested, (limit of two (2) llamas per pen) Indicate on the stalling request form your preference for location and number of pens. Indicate if you would like a display area and include sketch of layout as needed. If your animals are prone to jumping you should plan on providing some device to encourage them to stay in the stall. As there are a limited number of available pens no guarantees of location and number of pens can be made. Pen and entry fees are due and payable by the entry close date.
18. As per ALSA requirements each llama entered must pay a \$5.00 ALSA Show Fee. Non ALSA member fee is \$30.00 per farm. These ALSA fees will be collected at the time of check-in at the State Fair. Do "NOT" include with your entry fees.
19. All premiums won will be paid through the offices of the California State Fair.
20. The selection of wool category will be determined by the owner, but can be changed at the discretion of the judge at the time of competition. If in doubt, check with the judge immediately following the initial exhibitor's meeting.
Suri Llama - Fiber has natural luster and hangs and drapes over the body forming a part along the spine. The fibers have a very distinctive and well defined lock structure, with many individual locks formed at the skin and carrying to the ends. Light Wool - Minimal body wool, short neck wool with smooth legs. Medium Wool - Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool. Heavy Wool - Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool (i.e.; leg wool at least to knee and hock).
21. Enter all Halter Classes according to sex, age and wool length of the llama as defined in these rules.
22. Age of llama must be specified on each entry form. Age limits are 5 months and older. On a llama's date of birth, the llama moves up to the next older class.
23. Exhibitors must designate the name of the official handler for each class on their entry forms.
24. Open, Novice and Advanced shall be defined as follows: Open - Open to all entries Novice - Open to all entries who have won less than three ribbons, 1st, 2nd or 3rd place or any combination of those placings in an Open, Novice or Young Pack division of a respective ALSA approved class. After placing 1st, 2nd or 3rd once in a Novice division class, you "may" choose to enter Advanced. Advanced - Open to entries that have previously placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd place in an Open, Novice or Young division of a respective ALSA approved class.

25. Youth Classes: These classes are available to Youth that are 8 years old and have not passed their 19th birthday as of January 1, of the current year. A llama may be owned or leased or loaned to the youth exhibitor and must be trained and prepared by the youth for the three months prior to the fair. The youth must submit a statement to this effect signed by the leader or parent. There shall be three age divisions available for each youth class. They are: Seniors: 14 to 18 years of age; Intermediates: 11 to 13 and Juniors: 8 to 10 years of age. All ages are determined as of January 1, of the current year. Entry fee is required. The junior's parent or legal guardian must sign entry form and permission slip.
26. A youth exhibitor may choose to show in Adult or Novice Showmanship. In doing so, the Junior exhibitor shall not be permitted to enter any other youth llama showmanship classes at this or any other subsequent California State Fair.
27. A youth exhibitor may enter only one animal in each youth class, as the youth is awarded ALSA points in youth classes, not the llama. Rosettes through sixth place. Premiums are as listed in Youth classes.
28. ALSA recommends that exhibitors 8 years through 12 years of age not show intact males over 24 months of age. Youth exhibitors will be allowed to show intact males at this show.
29. Classes may be split or combined by Show Management as allowed by the ALSA rules.
30. Animals may only show in ONE Performance Division (animals showing in Youth Division may NOT show in Open or Novice Division).
31. All llamas must have a halter on at all times while on the fairgrounds.
32. All llamas will be housed in pens on the fairgrounds and must remain on the premises for all four days of the show.
33. Pack class exhibitors must provide a saddle and panniers suitable for back country use, complete with weight and fill materials as per ALSA regulations. All packs must have two cinches. Panniers must be removable except for Youth Pack Classes.
34. Herdsman competition is a special competition created by the State Fair to encourage attractive, educational, and high quality presentations of all livestock exhibits. Exhibitors must sign up at the livestock office the day of check-in to be included in the competition. (See Division 6725 Herdsman Competition section for more details.)
35. No vehicles allowed in the livestock barns overnight.
36. Exhibitors using stall mats or artificial turf must remove and thoroughly clean these surfaces daily.
37. Llamas are to remain in the immediate barn area throughout the show and are prohibited from entering the midway and other non-livestock areas without being accompanied by a fair official.

GROUP CLASSES

If the exhibitor(s) of classes 36 and 37 are not the sire's/ dam's owner, they must have written permission of the sire's/dam's owner. ALSA points for these classes will go to the Sire and Dam of these classes, not the exhibited animals. The Sire or Dam do not need to be present.

36. Get of Sire – group to consist of three llamas, all sired by the same sire and from at least two different dams, may be either sex, sire must be named. One entry per sire.
37. Produce of Dam – group to consisting of two animals, either sex, the produce of one dam which must be named. One entry per dam.

STATE FAIR LLAMA CHAMPIONS

The State Fair Llama Champion Awards recognize the best all-around llamas in their respective gender divisions. This award category is open to all llamas participating in either Novice or Open/Advanced classes and meeting the following STATE FAIR LLAMA CHAMPION criteria:

The llama and same handler must compete in all four (4) Mandatory classes; the appropriate Halter, Obstacle, PR and Fiber class. Extra points can be earned by competing in the Pack Classes. Handler names will be recorded by the Gatekeeper prior to entering the arena. Scores will be based on the totals of the mandatory classes plus any extra point classes. Scoring will use a modified chart provided at check-in. The score in Halter, then Obstacle, the Public Relations, and then Pack will be used to break a tie.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD

Anyone showing in the open llama classes shall be considered for the Premier Exhibitor Award. Selection of the Premier Exhibitor shall be made by the show committee on the afternoon of the last day of the fair, based upon observations of best individual demonstration of Premier Exhibitor Award criteria during the fair. Premier Exhibitor shall be awarded at the conclusion of the llama competition. Criteria for consideration shall be sportsmanship, attitude, appearance of self and llama(s).

Sportsmanship: Considerable participation in llama show classes. Sharing time, expertise or resources to assist other exhibitors outside the ring; examples: set up, animal care, or showing. Being on time for all classes. Consideration for others while in the show ring. Support for youth activities by attendance and etc.

Attitude: Project overall enthusiastic demeanor. Graciousness in victory or defeat. Project positive posture about show placements/judging. Willing participant in State Fair llama related events such as dinner and PR parades. Available for public interaction during llama event down time. Knowledgeable, friendly and enthusiastic in sharing llama information with others, especially the public. Demonstrate a caring/ working relationship with the llama(s) being shown.

Appearance: Clean, well groomed, class appropriate attire in accordance with ALSA guidelines. Llama tack clean and class appropriate in accordance with ALSA guidelines. Llama clean, well groomed in show ring. Llama pen(s) and ranch display area neat and clean.

MOST CREATIVE RANCH PRESENTATION

To encourage exhibitors to decorate their ranch displays and pens to highlight the Fair's theme the following criteria has been established.

1. Must exhibit in at least one class where the animal is required to be present.
2. Must enter at check-in to be considered.
3. Groups will be judged as one entry with one (1) Rosette presented to the group if named winner.
4. Entries will be judged daily on the following attributes;
 - a. Relevance to State Fair Theme – max. 50 points daily
 - b. Extent of coverage of entire stalling/display area – max. 25 points daily
 - c. Neatness and Marketing Appeal – max. 15 points daily
 - d. Informative – max. 10 points daily
5. Maximum 100 points daily, total maximum 400 points.
6. Judging to be done by State Fair or Show Management once on each of the 4 days of the fair. The scores will be combined. The exhibitor with highest total points will be the award winner.
7. Award to be presented at the Awards Ceremony.
